

Manual – How to translate web browser content to another language

This manual explains how to make use of different browsers auto-translating features.

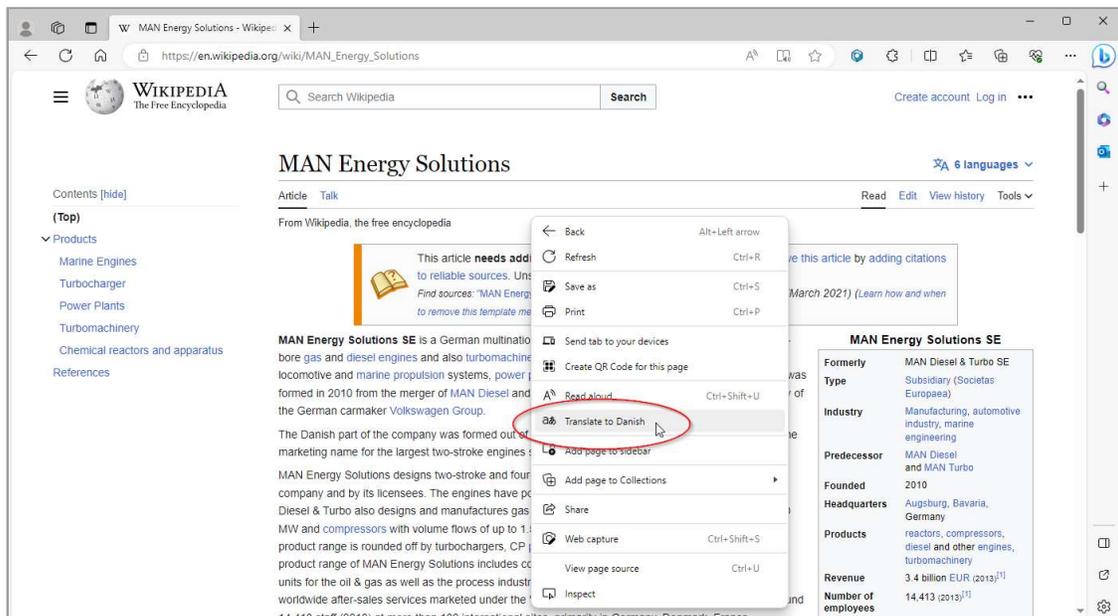
This tutorial is complemented with screenshots of the [Wikipedia page for MAN energy solutions](#) as an example page to translate. A screenshot of just the page is provided below.



Desktop Browsers

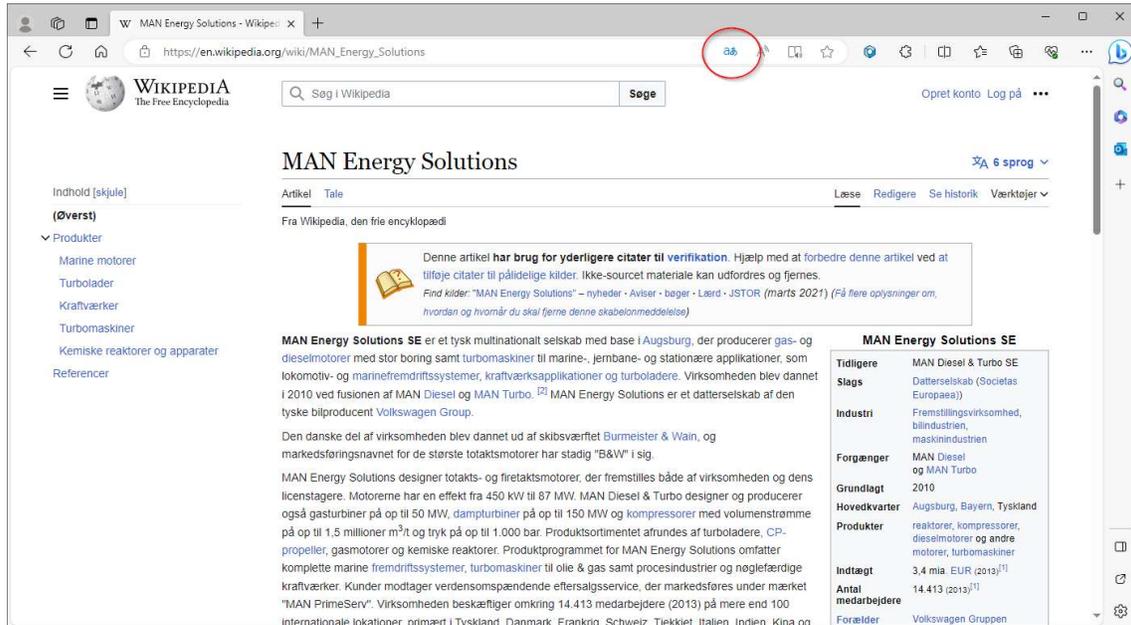
Microsoft Edge

1. Right-click anywhere inside a webpage you wish to translate and click “Translate to [Default Language]”.

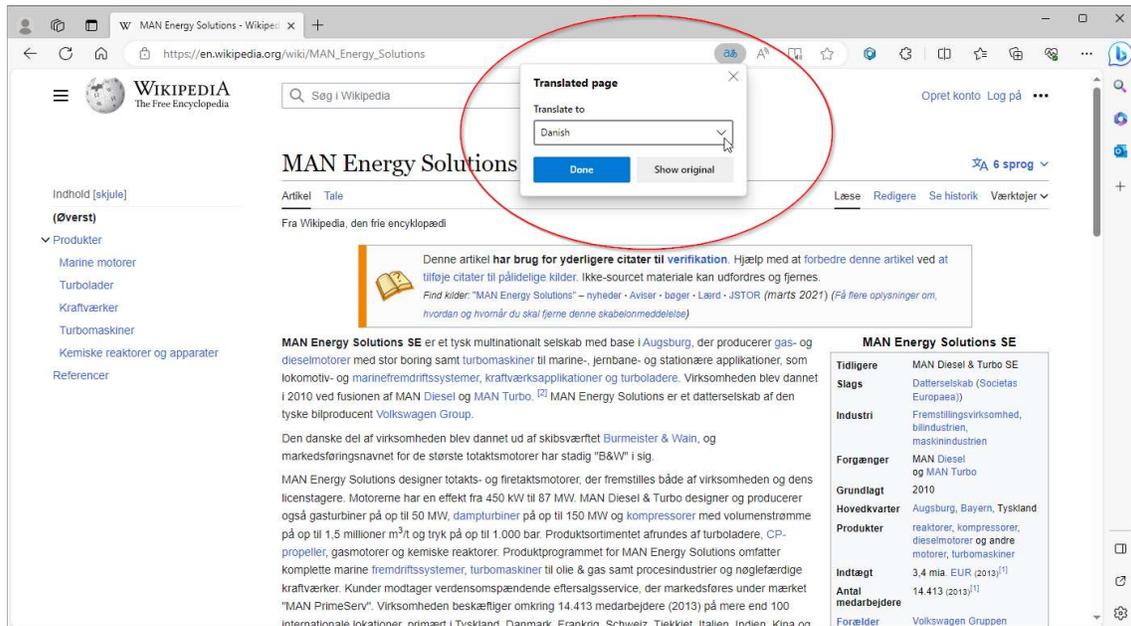


Depending on the default language of your browser, it may suggest another language.

- If you wish to translate the page to a different language, first follow step one. Then an icon will have appeared on the right side of the address bar:

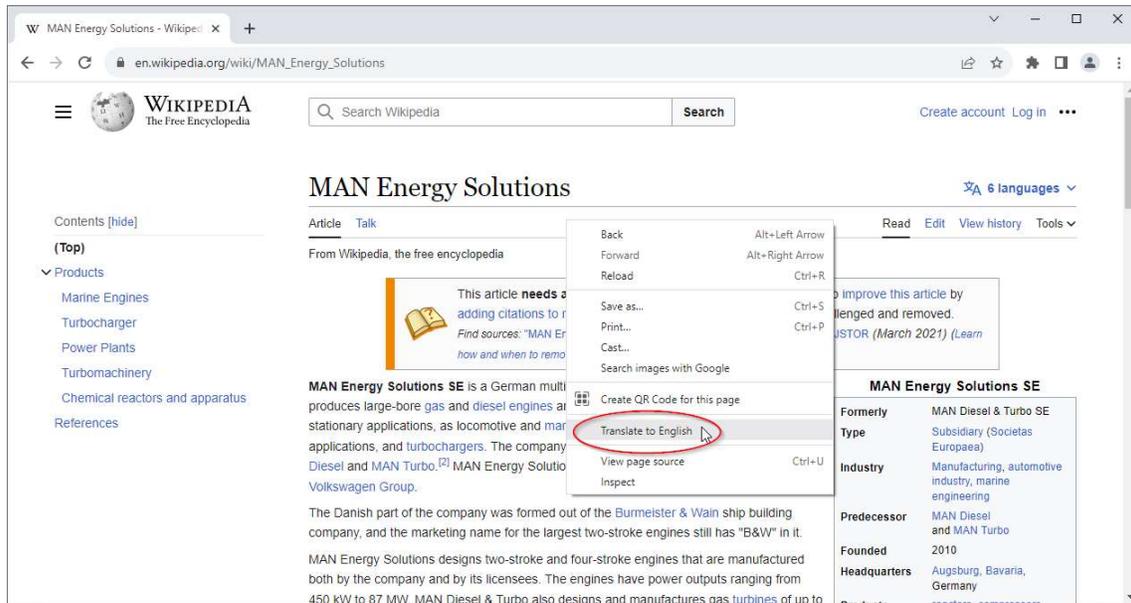


Click the icon and select the language you wish to translate to:



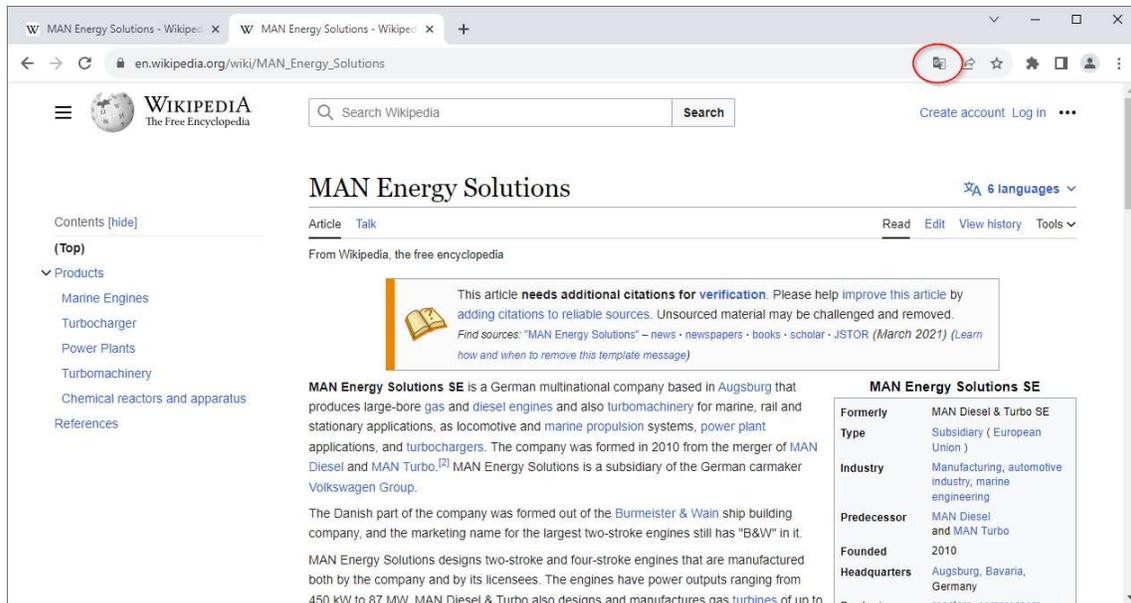
Google Chrome

1. Right-click anywhere inside a webpage you wish to translate and click “Translate to [Default Language]”.

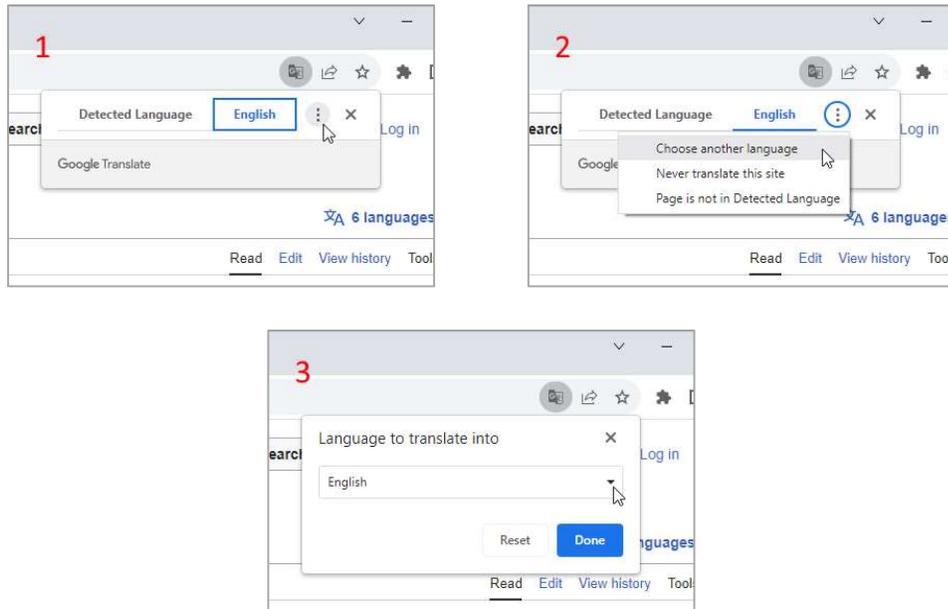


Depending on the default language of your browser, it may suggest another language.

2. If you wish to translate the page to a different language, first follow step one. Then an icon will have appeared on the right side of the address bar:



Click the icon, and in the menu that opens, click the three dots and choose the language you wish to translate to:



Safari

1. In the Safari app on your Mac, go to the webpage you wish to translate. If the webpage can be translated, the address bar (“Smart Search Field”) will display a translate button:

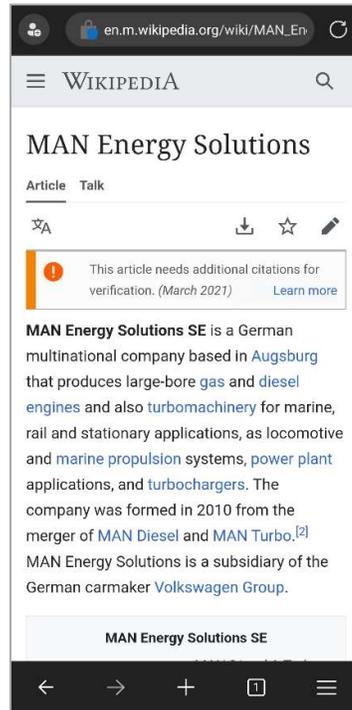


2. Click the translate button and choose the language you wish to translate the page to.
3. If the language you wish to translate to is not available, you may have to add the language in your Macs “Language & Region” settings. After you add a language to your list of preferred settings, if a translation to that language is available, it will appear in the translate menu in Safari.

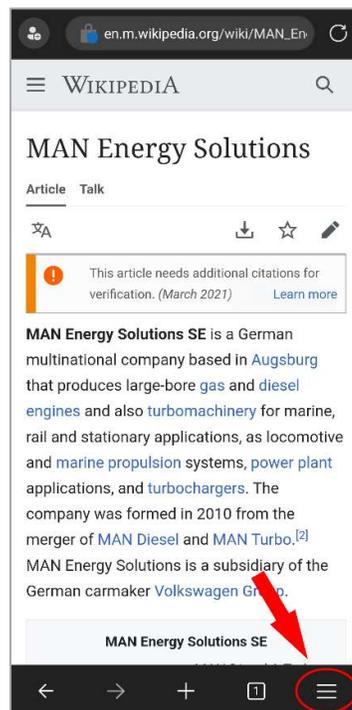
Mobile Phone Browsers

Microsoft Edge – Android

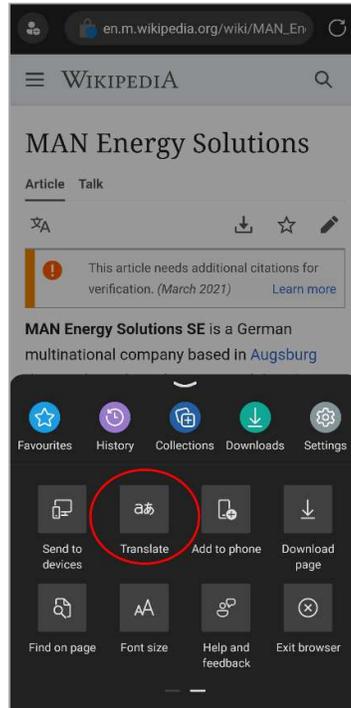
1. Open the webpage you would like to translate



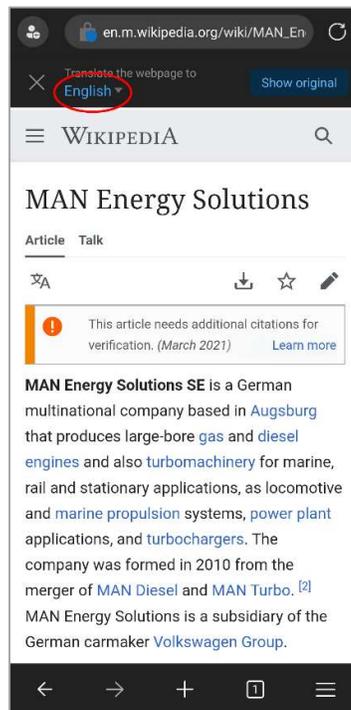
2. Press the burger menu in the bottom right corner



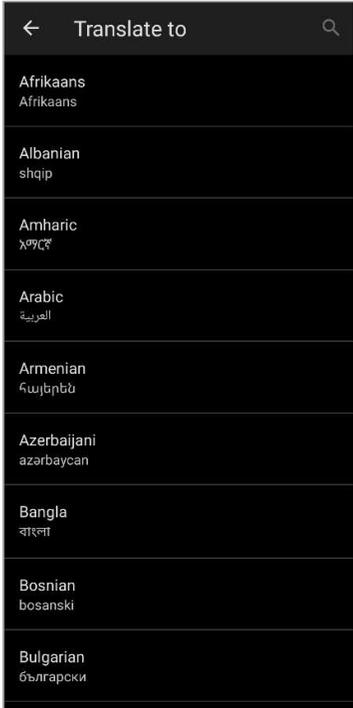
3. Swipe left in the menu, and press "Translate". This will translate the page to the default language of your browser.



4. If you wish to change the language to a different one, select the language at the top of the screen.

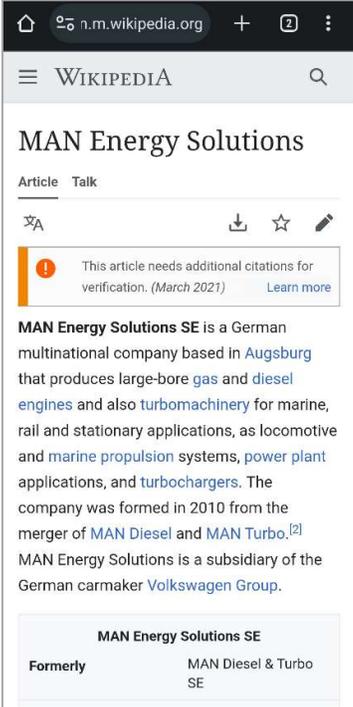


- 5. Select the language from the list you wish to translate the page to.

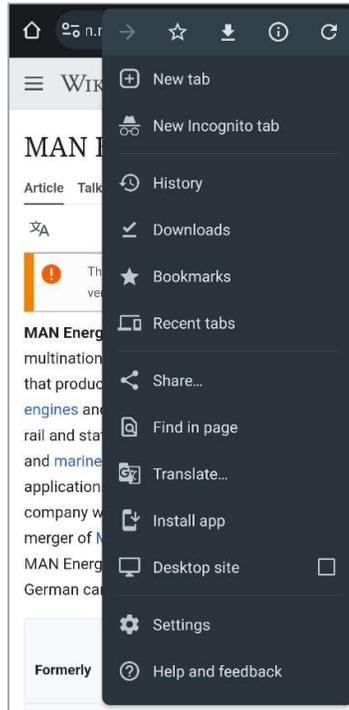


Google Chrome – Android

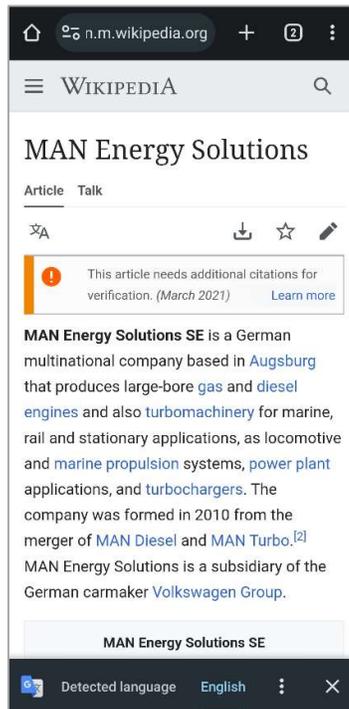
- 1. Open the webpage you would like to translate



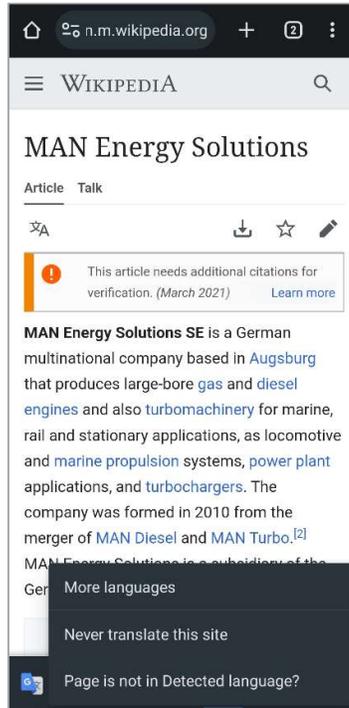
2. Open the 3-dot menu in the top right corner



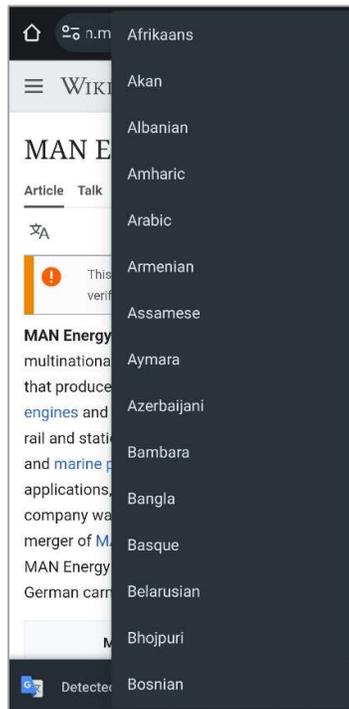
3. Press "Translate..."



4. Press the 3-dot menu that has appeared in the bottom of the screen, and select "More languages"



5. Select the language you wish to translate to



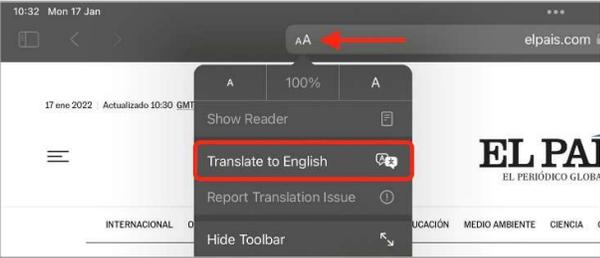
Safari – iOS

1. Open the webpage you would like to translate, and watch for the address bar to indicate that a translation is available

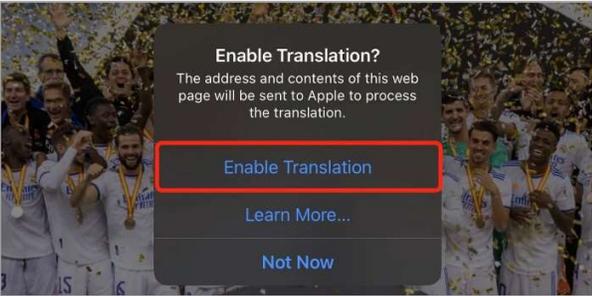


2. Press the “aA” button in the far left of the address bar, and select “Translate to [Default Language]” in the dropdown menu

(If you do not see the option to translate, the webpage is either incompatible with Safari’s translation feature or the language is not supported)



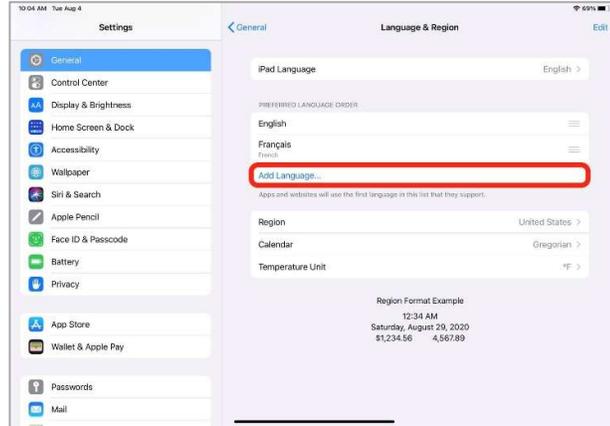
3. Press “Enable Translation” in the prompt if required



4. If you wish to translate the page to a different language, you may have to add more languages to your Apple device. Follow the below steps to do so:

1. Launch the “Settings” app on your Apple device
2. Navigate to “General” and “Language & Region”

3. Press “Add Language...”



4. Select a language from the list
5. Press “Keep [Your Preferred Language]” to keep the current system language and confirm this selection as an additional webpage translation option.
